NEW: The Church Treasurer is pleased to report that the total collected for The Salvation Army was £2,198.35. Well done everyone!

The Salvation Army (Scottish Charity No: SC 009359). This charity is well-known to us all, but we may not be aware of the many ways in which it puts its Christian faith into action. For example, to reduce homelessness it offers night shelters, nap pads, support for rough sleepers, life-houses (Dundee has two), drop-ins, outreach, addiction services and other initiatives to tackle the cycle of homelessness. It also offers budget and debt advice and employment support to help people become job-ready. Its services are diverse and responsive to the realities of life in the communities it serves. The Kirk Session commends the work of The Salvation Army. PRESBYTERY OF PERTH:

NEW: Unions and Linkages: One of the predictions for 2024 for the Presbytery of Perth by the Presbytery Clerk was 'that we look forward to a large number of Services of Linking and Services of Union.' These have now started, with Presbytery Services in the next month to mark: a new congregation of Carnoustie Trinity, formed from three existing congregations in the Carnoustie area; a linkage between four congregations just north of Kinross-shire of Dunbarney (Bridge of Earn), Forgandenny, Aberdalgie and Forteviot; a new congregation of Dundee North-East from four previous congregations. This union has decided on no separate church building but to use existing community facilities. And a new congregation of Broughty Ferry, formed from the union of four existing churches in Broughty Ferry and Barnhill. **Presbytery:** The office is Suite F3, Riverview House, Friarton Road, Perth, PH2 8DF. Prayer Points for the week commencing Sunday, 14th January 2024

Sunday 14th: Pray for Austin Wicks as he preaches for the congregations of Clackmannan and Sauchie & Coalsnaughton this morning and for the congregations as they vote on calling him as parish minister, that God's leading may be clearly discerned. Pray also for Brenda Fraser preaching in Kinross and Alan Reid preaching at Portmoak and at Orwell today.

Monday 15th: Ask for God's peace to be known in a miraculous way today in situations of conflict such as in Ukraine and in Israel and Palestine.

Tuesday 16th: As the Outreach Group meets this evening pray for the guidance and enabling of the Holy Spirit in all that is discussed and planned for the coming year.

Wednesday 17th: Pray for the Pastoral Group meeting this afternoon as they continue to seek the best way to offer pastoral care to the congregation as a whole and to the vulnerable, in particular.

Thursday 18th: Take time to be still and know that the Lord is God in the midst of what you are doing today. Listen for the prompting of the Holy Spirit in your own life.

Friday 19th: Lift before God those who face persecution for their faith not only in faroff places but even in our own country that all who seek to follow Jesus may stand up for Him day by day.

Saturday 20th: Pray for those involved with the ministry of Kythe as they hold their annual development and planning day today, that God's leading may be clearly discerned.
