Kin-nections for March - May: This year we are producing a 16-page full-colour 2023 Review that highlights the activities of our congregation. The Review will be delivered to members in March. So that folk are not overwhelmed with reading material, and to reduce costs, the Kirk Session has agreed to produce a "mini" Kin-nections for March—May, to supplement the Review: just one folded sheet of A4. Therefore, we are not seeking articles for this issue of Kin-nections. If you have an urgent piece of information to highlight, e.g. a date of a forthcoming event, please email it in by 12 noon on Monday, 29th January and we will see if it is possible to include (though it might only be date and time, at best). Items can obviously be highlighted in the weekly Intimations and in the Saturday email of news. Normal service will resume for the June—August issue!

PARISH GROUPING: Progress on Parish Grouping:

Joint Vision Group of Kinross and Orwell & Portmoak Church
Highlights of 17 January 2024 Meeting

If you have questions, comments or suggestions, please speak with the Minister or Session Clerk or send an <u>email</u> as we welcome everyone's input.

- The group explored four questions raised in a discussion paper from Revd. Alan Reid and Revd. Robert Calvert.
 - What times should services be at following the union? It was recognised that there were pros and cons to services being held at the same time or at different times. On balance, the group was minded to support a service time of 10.30am at both Kinross and Orwell churches.
 - o What issues might need to be borne in mind regarding services other than Sunday mornings? Glenfarg, Kinnesswood and Scotlandwell are/will be without a community of Christian witness. Offering perhaps monthly services in local buildings, not necessarily on Sundays, could be an important way of including these communities.
 - o **Could we start to do more sharing across the two parishes before union takes place**? It was felt strongly that, rather than waiting for **1**st **January 2025** as the point at which the congregations come together, general moves can and should be taken now. Suggestions include Messy Church, youth activities, Christian Aid Week, house groups and mission partners. A joint Saturday email of news would enable shared information. A vision statement would encapsulate the joint churches' vision.
 - What are the implications of union for areas of ministry such as school chaplaincy and trusteeships? Historically the local minister has been expected to be school's chaplain and to serve on

the board of various charities, e.g. Arthur and Margaret Thompson Charitable Trust. Team ministry and the appointment of a KYTHE youth minister will allow this to be reviewed so these important roles are covered, but responsibility does not fall on one minister.

- **Team Ministry**: it is recognised that Presbytery support will be important for Cleish and Fossoway in moving towards their union and calling a minister who will be part of the Team.
- **Feedback**: the Joint Vision Group welcomes comments, questions and suggestions from the congregations: please speak with a minister or contact orwellandportmoakchurch@gmail.com or office@kinrossparishchurch.org
- Next meeting: Wednesday, 14th February to share updates from sub-groups together with any
 questions for consideration, and to plan for Thursday, 22nd February Joint Session meeting.

PRESBYTERY OF PERTH:

NEW: Presbytery Meeting: The next meeting of the Presbytery of Perth for ordinary business is on **Saturday**, 3rd **February** at 10.30am in St Matthews Church, Tay Street, Perth. This is the Presbytery's first hybrid meeting, allowing presbyters to join online though it's hoped that many will still come in person, so that presbyters can continue to get to know one another better. The meeting will include a session focusing on the situation in Gaza with input from the Church of Scotland ministers at Jerusalem and Tiberias: St Andrews. In the afternoon, there will be a conference session focusing on the Presbytery's first year and on where we are going in the future.

NEW: New Ecumenical Visit to Women in Custody: The Moderator of the General Assembly and a Catholic Archbishop visited the country's national facility for women in custody last week. Rt Rev Sally Foster-Fulton and Most Rev Leo Cushley, Roman Catholic Archbishop and Metropolitan of St Andrews and Edinburgh, were welcomed to HMP & YOI Stirling. The ecumenical visit also gave the Moderator and the Archbishop the opportunity to see the prison chaplaincy service, which offers spiritual and pastoral support and guidance to those in custody of all faiths and none.

Prayer Points for the week commencing Sunday, 28th January 2024

Sunday 28th: As we celebrate the sacrament of baptism this morning, pray that we may all be blessed by this sign and seal of God's grace, and all recommit ourselves to following Christ.

Monday 29th: Pray for all the children and young people of our church family that they may know that they are loved and that they may each come to a living faith in Jesus.
