

Prayer Diary - August 2021

During August we move from the refreshment of holiday time through the activity of Family Week to preparing for the beginning of a new session in the life of the church. Let us take time this month to bathe every aspect of the life and work of the congregation in prayer and to seek God's blessing.

Sunday 1st August – *John 12:23-25* – At the beginning of Family Week, pray that we may all be involved, whether through prayer or in person, with this significant outreach to our community. Morning Service at 10.30am. Time for Prayer on Zoom at 6pm. [Station Rd, Kirklands Ct, Swansacre, Lomond Mews, Queen's Cres, Douglas Cres, Primary School]

Monday 2nd – *Revelation 14:12-13* – Ask God's blessing on all five venues being used for Family Week groups: Kinross Parish Church, Swansacre Nursery, the Gospel Hall, St James' Church and St Paul's Church. [High St (Bank of Scotland to Church Centre), Police Houses, St. Ronan's Dr, Chambers Ct, Talla Pk]

Thursday 5th – *Ruth 1:1-2* – Pray that the message of the Gospel of the grace and love of God may be shared, winsomely and powerfully, in word and deed during Family Week. [Sandport, Sandport Gait, Nan Walker Wynd, Sandport Close, Pier Rd]

Friday 6th – *Ruth 1:3-5* Pray that there may be fruit from the labours of Family Week and blessing for families in our community. [Parliament Square, Brewery Lane, School Wynd, Piper Row, Whyte Ct, Smith St, Myre Terrace, Curate Wynd]

Saturday 7th – *Ruth 1:15-18* – As the September issue of *Kin-nections* is put together pray for all involved in the editorial team and in the wider Admin and Comms group. [High St (Church Centre to Todd & Duncan), Queich Pl, Old Cleish Rd, Bridgend]

Sunday 8th – *Ruth 1:19-20* – Give thanks for all who join in the various prayer times during the week as well as in using this prayer diary. Unite your heart with them in seeking God's blessing on our church and community. [Bowton Rd, Montgomery Rd, Ross St]

Wednesday 11th – *Ruth 2:19-20* – Give thanks that the Craft Group is able to meet in person again and pray that their times together may be fruitful in all kinds of ways. [Ochil View, Churchill Rd, Emslie Dr, Macdonald Avenue, Alexander Dr]

Tuesday 17th – *Ruth 4:2-6* – Pray for school pupils and parents, as they prepare for the beginning of term tomorrow, that those who are nervous may find calm. [Lathro Pk (North), Courcelles Ct, Lathro Ct, Lathro Lane]

Wednesday 18th – *Ruth 4:9-10* – Give thanks that the financial position of the congregation has remained relatively stable during lockdown, but pray for wisdom for the Finance Committee as they make plans for the future. [Acremoar Drive, Lathrocht Grove]

Thursday 19th – *Ruth 4:13-17* – Pray for those who struggle to sleep at nights and those who work through the hours of darkness. Compline 9pm [Dalwhamie Street, Drumeuther Way]

Friday 20th – 1 Samuel 2:6-8 – Give thanks for the contact kept with church members through lockdown, and pray for the Pastoral Group as they plan how best to provide ongoing pastoral support. [Gallowhill Rd, Gallowhill Gardens, Mavisbank, Lomond Pl, Argyll Ct]

Saturday 21st – *Isaiah 55:1-2* – Pray for all involved in eco-church initiatives including the community allotments, litter-picking and energy saving measures. [Argyll Rd]
