Prayer Diary - December 2022/January 2023

Please bring before God each day the needs of individuals and of the wider world and pray especially for the ministry and mission of Kinross Parish Church.

Local Church and Community

Worship – ministers, those leading worship in prayer, music, children's ministry, flowers, welcome and refreshment teams. May God be honoured among us. **Discipleship** – personal prayer and Bible study; housegroups; Growing Young process; the Discipleship corner in the church. May we all grow in our faith. **Pastoral** – the sick and bereaved; elders and visitors; groups within the church (Craft Group, Guild, All Friends Together, Table Talk etc). May we nurture one another.

Outreach – litter-picking and allotment; monthly presence at the Farmers' Market; Food Tidings; support for Ukraine (including the weekly hub meetings for Ukrainian refugees locally), MAF, Christian Aid, Tearfund. May we point our community and our world to Jesus.

Admin and Communication – office team, website, Facebook, magazine, publicity. May the word be spread.

Finance and **Property** – those who give and those who steward those gifts; those who maintain the church and church centre and all who come and go in them, including lets to non-church groups.

Kythe – the staff and volunteers, trustees and management and that every young person in our community may know that they are loved by God.

Kinross Centre – the staff and volunteers and executive committee and that all service users may know that they are loved by God.

Broke not Broken – the staff and volunteers and all in our community who are facing serious financial and mental health challenges at the moment.

Wider Church, Nation and World

Churches in the Kinross-shire Networks and across the Presbytery of Perth – pray for all those involved in shaping what congregational life, and the administration and resources of it, will look like in the coming years.

The Church of Scotland and other denominations – pray for Rt Rev lain Greenshields, Moderator, and for all who stand up for Jesus in all areas of our national life.

Our partner church in Debrecen, Hungary – pray that we will be able to renew our summer exchange next year, building on past links.

The Hungarian-speaking church in Csongor, Ukraine as they provide accommodation and support for refugees.

The Persecuted Church – remember before God our sisters and brothers in Christ who face injustice and danger simply for standing up for Jesus.

Our Partnership with Mission Aviation Fellowship – pray for Ruth and Duncan Jack as they get to grips with their role with MAF in Uganda. Pray that there will be a good response to the special offering for MAF during September.

The King and the Parliaments in Westminster and Holyrood – remember all who carry responsibilities of leadership in our national life, that they may live and act with integrity and for the good of all. In particular pray for the new prime minister.

Situations of Conflict – name before God the many situations in our world where there is war: Ukraine, Afghanistan, Syria, Yemen, Myanmar etc – pray for peace and for the advance of God's Kingdom.

Fairtrade – give thanks for our own Fairtrade team and pray for those across the world who work for justice and equity.

Weekly Focus

1st to 3rd December - Advent Theme: Hope

Ask God to fill you with overflowing hope this Advent as you trust in the Lord.

Pray for Table Talk which meets on Zoom on 1st Dec.

Pray that many will find a welcome in the church through Cosy Spaces and that relationships may grow and develop through this initiative.

Remember the House Groups as they continue Advent studies.

4th to 10th December – Advent Theme: Peace

Lift before God the many conflict zones of our world and individuals who struggle to find peace in their hearts because of their circumstances. Pray for the healing of deep emotional hurts in the lives of many in our nation in these days.

Pray for all who are involved with Stepping Stones as Christmas draws near.

Pray for the work of Broke not Broken in our community especially at this season.

11th to 17th December – Advent Theme: Joy

Pray that the song of the angels may be heard in earth's darkest places

Pray for Let's Sing that music can touch those with dementia and their carers alike.

Seek God's guiding for the Kirk Session Council as they meet on the 13th.

Ask God's blessing on Laura Jane Smith and Kris Wilson as they are married on the 14th.

Pray for assemblies taking place this week in Nursery, Primary and High Schools.

18th to 24th December – Advent Theme: Love

Pray that the height and depth and length and breadth of the love of God may be made known this Christmas.

Pray for the service of Quiet Remembering on Monday 19th December, as people remember and give thanks for loved ones whom they are missing.

Pray for the Christmas Eve Crib Service and Watchnight Service, on 24th December, that those who attend may discover the power of the Christmas Gospel.

Give thanks for the work of Christians Against Poverty and pray that our Christmas offering this year for CAP may help them to bring transformation to many lives.

25th December to 7th January – Immanuel: God with us

Make time each day to pause consciously in the presence of God and give thanks for the gift of Jesus. Pray for the courage to make Christ known this coming year to those around you who have never experienced the blessing of God's nearness.

15th to 21st January – Older People


