Prayer Diary – January 2021

As the old year begins to fade and the new year dawns with hope of an end to the restrictions we have known these past months, let us spend time each day on our knees asking God to help us to rebuild our lives on surer foundations and with purer motives, and let us ask the Lord for a fresh outpouring of the Holy Spirit that will bring life in all its fulness to our community and to our nation. Lord, begin with me.

Friday 1st January – *John 1:1-5* – At the beginning of the year let us humble ourselves in repentance, and ask God to change us from the inside out. [Station Rd, Kirklands Ct, Swansacre, Lomond Mews, Queen's Cres, Douglas Cres Primary School]

Saturday 2nd – *Genesis 1:1-4* – Let us pray that God would give us a spiritual hunger such as we have never experienced before. [High St (Bank of Scotland to Church Centre), Police Houses, St. Ronan's Dr, Chambers Ct, Talla Pk]

Sunday 3rd – *Psalms 19:1-4* – Pray that God would bring deep unity and loving harmony to our church family, and a longing to be the kind of fellowship God wants us to be. Virtual Morning Service at 10.30am. Zoom Prayer time at 6pm. [Bell Gardens, Muirhead Crescent, Simpson Wynd]

If my people, who are called by my name, will humble themselves and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, and I will forgive their sin and will heal their land."
(2 Chronicles 7:14)

Monday 4th – *Psalms 8:1-9* – Ask God to lay on your heart the names of five people for whom you will pray regularly this year, that they may come to know Christ. Silent Meditation 8am. [Avenue Rd, Kinross House Estate, Coventry Pl, Mill St, Burns Begg St, Kirkgate, Old Causeway, Causeway Ct, Millbridge]

Tuesday 5th – *Psalms 24:1-2* – Ask God to raise up individuals for significant Christian service locally, and to the ends of the earth. [Sandport, Sandport Gait, Nan Walker Wynd, Sandport Close, Pier Rd]

Wednesday 6th – *Psalms 33:6-9* – On this Day of Epiphany, pray for a fresh revelation of Christ for the people of Kinross. Pray for a children's event being planned for today. Midweek Service 10.30am. Midday Time for Prayer. [Parliament Square, Brewery Lane, School Wynd, Piper Row, Whyte Ct, Smith St, Myre Terrace, Curate Wynd]

Thursday 7th – *Job 9:4-8* – Pray for those who mourn at this time that they may know God's promised comfort and peace. [High St (Church Centre to Todd & Duncan), Queich Pl, Old Cleish Rd, Bridgend]

Friday 8th – *Job 38:25-28* – Seek the healing touch of God for those who are sick, and for those struggling with broken relationships. [Bowton Rd, Montgomery Rd, Ross St]

"Everyone who heard Jesus was amazed at His understanding and His answers" (Luke 2:47)

Saturday 9th – *Isaiah 40:25-26* – Ask God to prepare the way for the preaching of the Word, that hearts may be ready to receive it and respond to it. [Montgomery St, Montgomery Way, Montgomery Ct]

Sunday 10th – *Isaiah 45:8* – Ask God to help us find ways to deepen our fellowship as a church family even during these days of physical separation. Virtual Morning Service at 10.30am. Zoom Prayer time at 6pm. [Levenbridge Pl, Devonvale Pl, Hopefield Pl, Junction Rd, Clashburn Rd, Clashburn Close, Clashburn Way]

Monday 11th – *Psalm 93:1-5* – Pray that the community of Kinross may know that we are Christ's disciples by our love, as He has commanded. [Ochil View, Churchill Rd, Emslie Dr, Macdonald Avenue, Alexander Dr]

Tuesday 12th – *Psalm 65:8* – Pray for the Growing Young team as they consider the results of the congregational survey that that has been completed by over 50 people [Green Rd, Green Pk, Green Wood.]

Wednesday 13th – *Psalm 65:9-13* – Pray for the staff at Kinross Centre, as they continue to support the most vulnerable in our community by the weekday delivery of a hot meal and a cheery face. Midweek Service 10.30am. Midday Time for Prayer. [Muir (Green Hotel to Springfield Rd), The Sycamores, Muirpark Rd, Muirfield Grove, Muir Grove]

Thursday 14th – *Psalm 104:5-9* – Remember those who have been isolated in care homes, or in their own home, over the last nine months and pray for their continued safe-keeping as the vaccination programme is rolled out. [Muir (Springfield Rd to Gallowhill Rd), Whinfield Dr, Whinfield Gardens, Broom Rd, Broom Ct, Sunnypark]

Friday 15th – *Psalm 104:13-15* – Pray that the many who have been engaging with the church online during the pandemic will discover the reality of warm fellowship in person when we are able to meet again as a church. [Muir (Gallowhill Rd to Leisure Centre), Burnbank Meadows, Lethangie Rd, Bishop View, High School]

Saturday 16th – *Psalm 148:1-6* – Ask God to prompt you to make contact with someone in the congregation today that you have not been in touch with for a while. [Lathro Pk (South), Gallowhill Wynd, Highfield Circle]

Sunday 17th – *Psalm 113:3-9* – Give thanks for the glorious Gospel of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ and pray that we may read God's Word with a greater openness in these days. Virtual Morning Service at 10.30am. Prayer for the Nation at 7pm. [Lathro Pk (North), Courcelles Ct, Lathro Ct, Lathro Lane]

Monday 18th – *1 Chronicles 16:23-27* – Pray that God will arrest your attention as you read the Bible and prompt you to act on what you have read. [Acremoar Drive, Lathrocht Grove]

"Let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven. (Matthew 5:16)"

Tuesday 19th – *Psalm 148:7-13* – Ask God to stir up in our young people a desire to share the message of Jesus with their peers in imaginative ways. [Dalwhamie Street, Drumethur Way]

Wednesday 20th – *Nehemiah 9:6* – Pray that we would all be doers of the Word, as well as hearers of it, in these days. Midweek Service 10.30am. Midday Time for Prayer. [Gallowhill Rd, Gallowhill Gardens, Mavisbank, Lomond Pl, Argyll Ct]

Thursday 21st – *Job 5:9-16* – Pray for an openness, amongst all who have a role to play in shaping the life of the church, to what God is saying to us at this time. Compline 9pm. [Argyll Rd]

Friday 22nd – *Isaiah 46:9-10* – Pray for a deepening of faith as God's Word is read and shared by individuals, in housegroups and in public worship. [Renton Dr, Morlich Pl, George Dr, Thompson Pl, Torridon Pl, Sandwood Pl, Rannoch Pl]

Saturday 23rd – *Jeremiah 10:6-7* – Pray for all those who are involved in the leading and broadcasting of Sunday services. [Sutherland Dr, St. Mary's Pl, Tummel Pl, Morar Pl, Katrine Pl]

Monday 25th – *Acts 17:24-27* – Pray for initiatives such as Let's Sing and the litter pick, which seek to bless the community in which we are set. [Wilson Ct, Springfield Pk, McWilliam Pl]

Tuesday 26th – *Psalm 139:14-16* – Give thanks for the developing work of Kythe among the young people of the county, and pray for Barry and Gillian and all involved as volunteers. [Beveridge Pl, McBain Pl, Gordon Pl]

Thursday 28th – *Psalm 145:8-13* – Pray that everyone in our community may have a good relationship with at least one Christian, and ask God to deepen those connections. [Rural South (B996) - Cleish Road, Classloch, Hatchbank]

Friday 29th – *Psalm 145:14-18* – Pray for Kathy Dain, as she seeks God's leading into future avenues for ministry following her placement here in Kinross. [Orwell & Portmoak]

Saturday 30th – *Psalm 86:15-17* – Pray that virtual contacts made during lockdown may be built upon in the coming months. [Cleish and Fossoway.]

Sunday 31st – *Micah 7:18-20* – Lift before God those who have been struggling with family life over the past months. Virtual Morning Service at 10.30am. Prayer for the Nation at 7pm. [Presbytery of Perth]
